Your Excellency:-

In the Note which you were good enough to address to me on July 31st last, No. 27910, Your Excellency informed me that the British Government accepted the proposal to nominate a Commission composed of Delegates of the two Governments to investigate questions relative to the ownership of the islands in the channel of the Juba and to the control of the waters of that river. The Governor of British East Africa has now approached the Regent of the Benadir Colony with a view to nominating this Anglo-Italian Commission.

In the meanwhile a peninsula has been formed between the new and the old mouths of the Juba which obstructs the latter channel and it would seem advisable that the labours of the Commission should include this point and should also extend to all questions of a similar kind which are of common interest to the

including those relative to the customs régime.

My Government being in agreement with His Majesty's
Government as to the opportunity of expediting
this matter, I have the honour to request that Your

to this matter.
