observed that Blasting Powder is not included in the
list of stores absolutely prohibited.

against its shipment can with safety be modified, and

enquiries have been completed.

Regulations governing the Shipment of dangerous cargo in
vessels which carry stores for the Government of India.

1. No liquid (turpentine excepted) having a flash point^{*} of less than 110° may be carried under deck, and no liquid (ether and carbon bisulphide excepted) having a lower flash point than 50° may be carried. Packages should be of a suitable size so as to be easily handled in case of emergency. The maximum weight of a package for deck stowage containing spirit, or acid in drums, &c., should not exceed 3 cwt.,† and all deck cargo must be secured to the satisfaction of the India Office Surveyor before the vessel leaves the berth.

2. Shipment of the following articles is *absolutely prohibited*.

Acetylene gas.
Benzine, benzole, benzolene, or similar compounds.
Carbide of calcium.
Dynamite.
