

In reference to our recent interview with you, we would request you revise print of this contract in duplicate, adding certain amendments which we have made in view of your instructions such amendments being underlined. We enclose copy of such points for your reference and we would direct your attention to clause 7 as now amended.

It will be noticed in the draft of the name of the Company for that scheme Company has inserted it necessary to add the letters "Ltd." to the revised print. It is suggested that you make the amendment of the name of the Company and, when you do so, to let us know at what date you propose to bring into effect, also

satisfactorily and efficiently carried out
and that the materials to be supplied shall be
of good quality and that the works shall be
well and properly performed and maintained.

I wish to inform you that, after fur-
ther consideration, Mr. Lyttelton concurs with
me in the opinion that the ~~Engines~~ proposed
by Mr. Hirtzel are not ~~satisfactory~~ strong to be
accepted ~~for the proposal~~. It is, however,
no part of the business of electrical engineer
to guarantee the carrying out of a third per-
