Mr. Lileman to be informed, with reference to Co. letter of Aug. 27, 1908 (28642) re his reply (402306) that he is not eligible for gratuity. Opposite to be informed that it has been decided, after communication with the Treasury, that as the organization existing in Lileman's retirement is not productive pecuniarily he cannot be awarded compensation.

Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 17th instant (6508/1909), further respecting the case of Mr. J. Likeman, late Inspector of Police in the East Africa Protectorate, from which it appears that the reorganization as the result of which this officer is retiring is not productive of economy.

In reply I am to request you to inform the Earl of Cress that My Lords would have no power to award compensation to an officer retiring from the Home Civil Service in similar circumstances, and that accordingly they do not feel able to sanction any award to Mr. Likeman from Protectorate Funds.
