Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 17th instant (6508/1909), further respecting the case of Mr. J. Likeman, late Inspector of Police in the East Africa Protectorate, from which it appears that the reorganization as the result of which this officer is retiring is not productive of economy.

In reply I am to request you to inform the Earl of Crewe that My Lords would have no power to award compensation to an officer retiring from the Home Civil Service in similar circumstances, and that accordingly they do not feel able to sanction any award to Mr. Likeman from Protectorate Funds.
