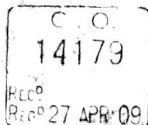

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Antrobus's letter of the 6th instant (7168/1909) and the accompanying copy of a letter from the India Office preferring a claim for £660.2.9 against the Government of the East Africa Protectorate in respect of a Royal Warrant pension issued to the widow of Captain McLeod James Gordon, Indian Staff Corps, whose death was certified to have been caused by military duty while on active service with the Ogaden Punitive Force.

In reply I am to request you to inform Secretary the Earl of Crewe that My Lords agree that instructions should be given to satisfy the claim now put forward.
