Sir,

I have the honour to submit the revised proof of my report on the Forests of British East Africa. The corrections and additions to this report, following my further exploration of the Kenya Forest, have now been made, in accordance with instructions.

This has necessitated considerable alteration and if it be thought desirable that I should see the final proof I shall be happy to do so on my arrival in England in April next.

The collection of Forest Photographs now submitted are much improved by the addition of those taken by Mr. Ross. The collection now possesses a unique value, and I trust that as many as possible of the photographs will be enlarged and re-reduced in view of the importance of advertising the present wealth of British East Africa and thus attracting the capital required for working the forests. This, as I have pointed out, is the policy being followed with regard to the best of the Australian forests, a policy which has already given the best results in attracting capital to the Jarrah Forests of West Australia.

My special Kenya report (Colonial Report Misc. No. 41 of June 1907) now requires revision. DKH

This can be done on the receipt of Mr. Rees' in  
Kenya plan. His rough preliminary plan did not  
reach me until the eve of my departure from Mon-  
basa. I propose submitting the revised Kenya  
Report together with Appendix 2 "Indigenous tim-  
bers" at a later date.


