In reply to your letter number 30265 I have the honour to append the names and addresses of the three Foresters selected to fill vacancies on the staff of foresters in British East Africa.

I should add that the selection of these men has entailed considerable correspondence and work. As vacancies are certain to arise hereafter I have judged it useful to append a list registering the names of those candidates who appear suitable for future employment; and I have put into separate lists those who have been interviewed and those who so far as can be judged appear suitable but whom I have not had an opportunity of interviewing. I have received some two hundred and fifty applications for these vacancies of which about two hundred had to be seriously considered. It is evident that there is no difficulty in obtaining foresters on the terms offered and it may be a question whether the commencing salary of the forester who is not an expert plane-tableer should not be £100 instead of £120.
