Sir,

I am directed by the Earl of Crewe to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, he proposes to select you for temporary employment as a 2nd officer in the Lake Victoria steamer service of the Uganda Railway, with salary at the rate of £240 per annum, and quarters free of rent (but not of rates or similar outgoings) or an allowance in lieu.

2. A memorandum showing the

general

Gardens S.W., will be instructed to prepare the necessary agreement embodying the conditions of your engagement.

4. I am to request that you will state whether you accept this offer, and if so, that you will inform me whether you are prepared to leave for the Protectorate by the ~~German~~ steamer which starts from Marseilles on the ~~1st of January~~. You would be provided with a free 1st class passage to the Protectorate.

5. You should at the same time furnish me with an address to which communications for your relatives or friends can be sent in your absence from this country.

General conditions attached to appointments in the Protectorate is enclosed herewith, in order that you may see the arrangements as to leave of absence; but you are to understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may hereafter be introduced by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

3. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these terms, you should present yourself to one of the medical advisers of this Department, whose names are given in the enclosed letter, for the purpose of being medically examined.

The letter is to be ~~detached and~~ left with him; and you will be required to pay him a fee of one guinea. He will send his report to this Department and, if it is satisfactory, the Crown Agents for the Colonies, whose address is Whitehall Gardens,
