Mr. Fowler's expedition

Mr. Fowler

The F.O. writes to us on 26 Jan. & expects
something to be done in a moment of
time. As it was need^d to tel. to
Gov. S.A., it is no fault of ours that
we cannot get the letters sent by
today at latest.

There are 4 points -

(1) Mr F. wishes to have a special
"shooting cap" - This is a matter solely
for the Prot. as to licences etc.

(2) He wishes letter of introdⁿ to
"auth^r of R.S.A." I suppose that
we can hardly refuse the ordinary
letter of introdⁿ to Gov. S.A.

(3) Cinematograph exp.

The Gov. notes that capture of wild animals is absolutely prohibited by law.

§ 35 of Game Ordinance, 1909 runs "It shall be unlawful to hunt with dogs any game on land other than private land" but the defⁿ in § 2 "game" means any animal mentioned in any of the schedules.

Lions & Leopards do not appear in the schedules.

I think the inference is clear (unless there is any other law of which I am not aware) that lions & leopards may be hunted with dogs.

The Ordⁿ referred to, further leads me to infer that there is no obstacle to Mr. Fowler's capturing lions & leopards or animals not mentioned in any schedule.

Mr. Curle has discussed this with Sir
F. Hopwood, Mr. Fiddes, & the Foreign
Office with the result shown on the red
slip annexed. The telegram, letters,
and despatch prepared on the previous
minutes have been stopped accordingly.

It is hardly within our power to
refuse to allow this expedition to go
if it is already on the high seas, and
provided that it complies with all the
laws and regulations, it can hardly
be prevented from landing in the
Protectorate and pursuing its purpose
there. But there is no doubt that the
strict application of the laws will cripple
its energies very considerably.

I gather therefore that we should

inform the F.O. that the B of B
does not consider that the expedition is
one which he would be justified in
assisting in any way, & that he here-
fore requests that he cannot request the
Govt to waive any of the ~~requirements~~
prescribed requirements or formalities
in its favour, and to furnish Mr. Fowler
with an introduction to the Govt of
the S. A. P. & telegraph to the Govt
that the expedition is one with to which
on further consideration he considers that
no special facilities or assistance should
be given, and that the ordinary laws and
regulations should be strictly applied to
it; & confirm this telegram by despatch.

10 With reference to your telegram
of the 25th of January, if dogs are
accompanied by certificate from
American veterinary authorities
that they come from district in
which rabies does not exist,
they can be landed without
restriction, otherwise after landing
they must undergo 48 days
quarantine at Nairobi to complete
100 days required. I should
like to point out that use of
dogs in capture of wild
animals absolutely prohibited
by law. I am not prepared
to remove prohibition in favour
of any one.
