My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Your Lordship's despatch No. 223 of the 22nd of April.

2. The expenditure to which Your Lordship has assented was not intended to exhaust the entire proceeds of the sale of cattle, though doubtless, as Your Lordship observes, the Irrigation Scheme for the natives will account for a portion of the balance.

3. Further developments in this direction will doubtless recommend themselves as time goes on, additional roads will require to be constructed, and agricultural expansion will demand an increased distribution of seeds. Your Lordship need not, I think, be apprehensive that we shall fail to discover means of spending the whole sum available for the benefit of the natives.

4. It must be remembered that the proceeds of the sale of the stock will not be received in their entirety.
