With reference to the letter from

this Office of the 10th of May, I am directed

by the Earl of Crewe to inform you that he

has received from the Governor of the East

Africa Protectorate a telegram of which a copy

is enclosed, relating to your proposals for the
development of Jubaland.

2. It will be seen from the telegram

that the Governor has no objection to Mr.

Argyropoulos transferring to you the areas of

land which he holds subject to fulfilment of

the conditions as to development imposed in respect of those areas; that of the new areas which you wish to acquire Farm 7 has been allotted and cannot be granted to you; that the other farms mentioned cannot be allotted to anyone till native rights have been settled and other applicants have been satisfied; that the Governor will, however, endeavour to meet your wishes by grants on the Juba, not necessarily the particular farm for which you apply; and that there must be delay in surveying as the Survey Staff is fully occupied elsewhere.

The Governor adds that the matter had better be settled locally on the usual terms and that even his telegram is liable to mis-understanding.

3. In view of the complexity of the matter and the Governor's opinion that Lord Crewe can only suggest it, you should

enter

enter into the further negotiations which are necessary with the Governor of the Protectorate.

4. His Lordship ~~has~~ not yet received

~~from~~ the Brown Agents for the Colonies a report ~~he~~ not yet received ~~upon~~ the evidence with which you were to furnish them as to your financial ability to carry out your proposals, but the Brown Agents have been asked whether they are now in a position to furnish that report, and the result of their enquiries will be communicated to the Governor. It is necessary that I am, etc.
