PHRASE OF TELEGRAM.

The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.  
(Received, Colonial Office, 8.15 p.m. 8th August, 1910). B.C. 9 AUG 10

August 8th. On the 3rd August at a general meeting of Colonists Association motion was proposed by Anderson, Editor of the Standard that "it is not necessary to enlarge on the somewhat to be scandalous parts several of the past [and] present unofficial members of Council have played in the criminal [and] civil courts of the country." This raised a storm but action ultimately (carried by motion of) Chairman, Delamare favouring proposal but not its immediate application. Deputation will wait on you until I should be given your Lordship's definite instructions on this preposterous proposal. Mr. ... has transferred his paper to Nairobi and is evidently seeking to upset Colonists Association. He has Central Committee in a political (?) disorder. Mr. ... has resigned chairmanship. As a result of indignation caused by Anderson's speech serious breach of peace was caused by the 8th of August 3rd. Anderson was removed from his home by eight or ten young men and handled rather roughly. Mr. ... gravated in presence of his wife. Anderson has conducted a series of attacks on his Predecessor and the Civil Service. He left "The Standard" on 1st August under the influence of the day before. I. e., however, did not know that the official had left. The paper will publish his address to the public. It is a well-known member. As the address I have seen has not been published in press I am obliged to tell you that no cognizance has been taken of the matter. It has been published in today's paper and I must ask your Lordship whether official cognizance should not be taken of these serious imputations on members of Council by the Government which appointed them. The matter, however, is rather complicated by the attack on Anderson.
