It is not a full title description. The Government
can not sell to the size of the farm, the date when it

The present law by which Crown Lands can
not be sold to the Government under the 1902 ordinance, which is
strictly the present being because the new ordinance has
not yet been sanctioned. The conditions on which land
can be sold or grant presented in the rules of
May 1906 issued under section 34 of the 1902 ordinance
comparatively those rules have limited the amount of
freehold to be given to any person. Under section 34
of the 1902 ordinance freehold could be acquired up to 1
acre or less by a special authority of the Government of
State (for more his approval was necessary) and a person
find among the conditions of lease laid down in that
ordinance a provision that a lessee, having acquired a

hereafter to govern the same that, so long as
necessary to purchase money, it appears to me that, so long as
Section 4 of the 1862 Ordinance held good, he was entitled to
acquire up to 320 acres, but that with the issue of the
1864 Law he lost that right and now only acquire free-
