The Governor of the East Africa Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

(Received Colonial Office 5.25.p.m.24th October, 1910)

No. 205 Duchess of Argyll applies for permission to travel Naiboi through Marsabit Moyale to Lugh where she will enter Italian territory. Journey from here to Frontier arduous but not dangerous. Moyale to Lugh would have to be provided with escort not quite certain of temperament of tribes or conduct towards white women. Route via Elwar to Bardera is not so objectionable. Sanction lately has been given for journeys (to) Abyssinia but not (to) women. Journey can be done but I should desire instructions in this instance.
