This telegram is very obscure but I think it is clear that

(a) there is a doubt whether Mr. Anguropoulos is at liberty to assign his holding of 4000 acres to the Joh Island Syndicate water between Mr. Anguropoulos & his late partner Mr. Chalmer's the Govt clearly cannot consent to the assignment until ^{the doubt} has been cleared up.

(b) it is now doubtful whether in view of the value of land

the time's plan for the development
of the district & a further lease of
~~the land~~ would in any case be
conceded to the Syndicate.

We have already told Mr. Welford
that we will accept his offer
to be bound by the conditions
of the lease in 1883, & have now
submitted our objection to it.

Concerning application to the Proprietary
for changing his term over subject
to the fulfilment of the conditions
of development, the Syndicate
are undoubtedly relying on this state-
ment. We might here observe
that from the last report of
the Committee a copy of which has been
made available to Mr. Chowne, Mr.
Welford's late partner against
the holding of the land.
