2. His salary is over £100 a year and he has over 11 years service and in view of these facts he would appear entitled to a pension at the rate of eleven sixtieths of his salary.

3. His work has always given satisfaction and accordingly enclose for Your Lordship's favourable consideration a computation showing the amount of pension which he has earned.

4. I have, pending Your Lordship's decision, sanctioned the grant of an alimentary allowance of Rs. 31/- (£18.00) which is practically nine tenths of Rs. 30.5/- the estimated amount of pension.

The Board having assembled proceed to examine Mr. Contractor and find that his vision is defective. The Board is informed by Mr. Contractor that his vision has been steadily and progressively deteriorating for the last three or four months. Distinct opacities exist in both eyes, probably in the lens. In view of the fact that there is a trace of albumen in the patient's urine, the Board consider that he should be detained in hospital for further treatment and observation, after which the Board will make a final report.

Head 6. - In the case of any Public Officer on the West Coast of Africa, a statement to be filed when he has a number of that Coast of Africa and Regulations, § 430.

Head 7. - State the description of Allowance for which the application is being made, the amount of Compensation Compensation Allowance or Gratuity, and the amount of the amount of Pension claimant is entitled to that Pension in respect of Professional or other special qualifications, the amount should be stated and verified by the authority under which the claim is made.

Head 8. - If the service has been interrupted by other things, the word "Interim" should be added before or after the name of the period, and the dates, dates and conditions of the breaks or breaks should be stated.

Head 9. - If the Person retiring has been in receipt of the whole or part of his salary from which he retires, for the 36 months preceding the date of his retirement, the amount annual of Salary or Wages in that date, the whole or part of the salary or wages, the average annual amount of Salary or Wages for all 36 months, and if during the last year or more should be inserted, provided the word "average," but if the whole period of service is less than three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

Head 10. - A separate statement should be made of the average amount of the 36 months immediately preceding the date of retirement, in the case of those who are entitled to a gratuity which is to be included in the calculation of the Pension of Gratuity.

When the value of a House or House of Property, or any other kind of estate, and the value of the mines and other dealings, are the property of the Person retiring, the value of the same should be stated, so that it shall not exceed the amount of the salary or wages for the 36 months immediately preceding the date of retirement.

Fees which an Officer is allowed to receive for his services shall be taken into account for Pension purposes, with a regular salary, at the annual amount of the net receipts of the person retiring, preceding the Officer's retirement. These net receipts shall be ascertained by deducting from the gross amount of Fees, such Office Expenses, as every officer may have had to pay in discharging his duties, in performing the services for which he was remunerated by Fees. No deduction is to be made from the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses, provided from Public Funds, for the discharge of those duties, in which a Fixed Salary is assigned. Particulars of the same should be forwarded to the Colonial Department, should be forwarded to the Colonial Department, showing the amounts received by them for Fees, and the amount defrayed as above for Office Expenses. At the end of the three years immediately preceding the retirement, it will be the duty of the Colonial Government concerned to satisfy themselves of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will not be any part of the Pension, and shall not be taken into account for Pension purposes, but the extent of money that has been received by the Pension claimant for fees for all or any part of the term of his service should be stated, and the amount of the same should be stated.

Head 11. - A statement should be made of the amount of the Medical Expenses incurred by the Person retiring, and the amount of the same should be stated, and the same should be verified by the medical officers of the Government.

Head 12. - In the case of any Public Officer, a statement to be filed when he has a number of that Coast of Africa and Regulations, § 430.

Head 13. - If a Public Officer, or any other person, has been allowed to have a private practice, without having declared to the Pension authorities, the same is to be fully stated.

Head 14. - If the Applicant is entitled to any Gratuity under his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the fact should be fully stated.

Head 15. - The description of service and other particulars of the computation are to be given. When an average of Salary is required, the mode of calculating it, whether by months, &c., is to be explained.
