My Lord,

Mr. Jagjivan Govind Contractor, 3rd Grade Clerk in the Customs Department, has recently been declared unfit for further service by a Medical Board, a copy of whose report is enclosed.

1. His salary is over £100 a year and he has served 11 years service and in view of these facts he would appear entitled to a pension at the rate of eleven sixtieths of his salary.

2. His work has always given satisfaction and I accordingly enclose for Your Lordship's favourable consideration a computation showing the amount of pension which he has earned.

3. I have, pending Your Lordship's decision, sanctioned the grant of an alimentary allowance of Rs. 31/- (£1.8.0) which is practically nine tenths of Rs. 33/- the estimated amount of pension.

A Medical Board composed as under, assembled at the Native Hospital, Mombasa, on the 20th of April 1910, for the purpose of reporting on Mr. Contractor's condition.

The Board having assembled proceed to examine Mr. Contractor and find that his vision is defective. The Board is informed by Mr. Contractor that his vision has been steadily and progressively deteriorating for the last three or four months. Distinct opacities exist in both eyes, probably in the lens. In view of the fact that there is a trace of albumen in the patient's urine, the Board consider that he should be detained in hospital for further treatment and observation, after which the Board will make a final report.

construction of Wimborne pier and that his work was most satisfactory.

During the six months that he was stationed at Msangeri he had two or three attacks of malaria and often performed his duties while suffering from these attacks.

**II. THE SERVICE OF PERSONS.**

Persons serving in the Army or Navy, or in the Royal Engineers, are duly attested.

**Head 1 of Paper.**—In the case of a Person serving on the West Coast of Africa, a statement should be added to the paper that it is a copy of Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, § 130.

**Head 2.**—State the description of Allowance for which the Applicant is recommended, the Supplementary Compensation, Allowance, or Gratuity, and its amount. In the case of Persons claiming an addition to their Pay, for transport by Professional, medical, special qualifications, this should be stated, and where necessary add brief note to the authority under which the claim is made.

**Head 3.**—If the service has been interrupted by one or more weeks, the word "Interruption" should be added before, or after, the number of days and months, and the causes, dates and circumstances of the break or breaks should be given, see Head 6, para 3.

**Head 4.**—If the Person referred to has been employed on the same service for the time from which he retires, for the 36 months immediately before the date of his retirement, the average annual rate of Salary or Wages paid during that period, and the date of his last receipt. If the average annual amount of Salaries or Wages paid for the 36 months, and if preceding the date of retirement, should be inserted, preceded by the word "or equal" but if the whole period exceeds three years, then the average for the whole period of service should be inserted.

**Head 5.**—A separate statement for each year from which service began, the sum mentioned being a quarterly payment of Government Monthly Allowance, and the weight of the gun barrel to be included in the calculation of the Extra Allowance.

Whenver the value of a House or Horses &c. is mentioned, state the value of the salary and other emoluments of the Officer, and the proportion of the value of the house or horses to that amount, so that it shall not exceed one fourth of the whole value of the house or horses.

Fees which an Officer is allowed to set by the first day of each month taken together with the Public Service, with regular salary, at the usual charge of the set receipts for the four quarters preceding the Officer's retirement. These fees are to be accounted by deducting from the gross amount of Fees and Office Expenses. As an Officer may have had to draw his annual allowances, in performing the service for which he was remunerated by Fees. No deduction is to be made from the Fees should be made in respect of Office Expenses provided from Public Funds, for the discharge of those duties to which a Fixed Salary is annexed. Papers of Particulars, when forwarded to the Colonial Department, should be accompanied by a Statement of all Officers' Fees, showing the amounts received by them for Fees, and the amount defrased above for Office Expenses &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement. It will be the duty of the Colonial Government to satisfy themselves of the accuracy of such statements before forwarding them to the Colonial Office. In the case of Officers receiving Fixed Salaries and Fees, the Fees will make up any deficiency or be allowed to cover for Pension purposes, to the extent of one third of the value of the Salaries, and any deficiency will be made up by all the amount of the fees, and the paper forwarded to the Colonial Office, should be accompanied by a Statement of all Officers' Fees, and the amount defrased above for Office Expenses &c., in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement.

Medical Officers, Surgeons, and Dispensaries, and the amount of Medical Expenses, are to be furnished showing the amount of pay given to the medical officer, and the amount of expenses of the Dispensary, &c. in each of the three years immediately preceding the retirement.

Indians, or Indians' Agents, or Indian Substitutes, should be supplied with a copy of the same, and a brief note should be added, by a Statement of the amount given to the Government.

**Head 6.**—A brief history of the Person's service.

In the case of Army Officers holding a regular commission, full details must be fully given, with a statement of the former rank, name of the Corps, Service, & place where he was connected with the permanent Civil Service, and the date of retirement.

**Head 7.**—In the case of a Person serving as a private Secular Civil Officer has been allowed to have "private practice," particular facts relating to the same, and the facts are to be fully stated.

**Head 13.**—If the Appointee ceases to be inducted into his service under Clause 102 of the Colonial Regulations, the facts should be fully stated.

The length of service and other parts of the computation greater be given. When an application is made for an addition, the date of commencement of it, who thereby more than 1/2 is to be explained.
