In the case of a navigable river of considerable size it
is clear that in places there may occur a deep
narrow channel and another broad shallow one
and a line is to be drawn between them adapted
for the purpose of navigation.

It is reasonable to think that the
line is to be drawn at the center of the
deepest channel and such authorities as
are accessible here and can only find
nothing on the subject.

It will simply mean "where the stream is navigable
the center of the deepest channel, or, as it is usually
called, the Thalweg, is taken as the boundary."

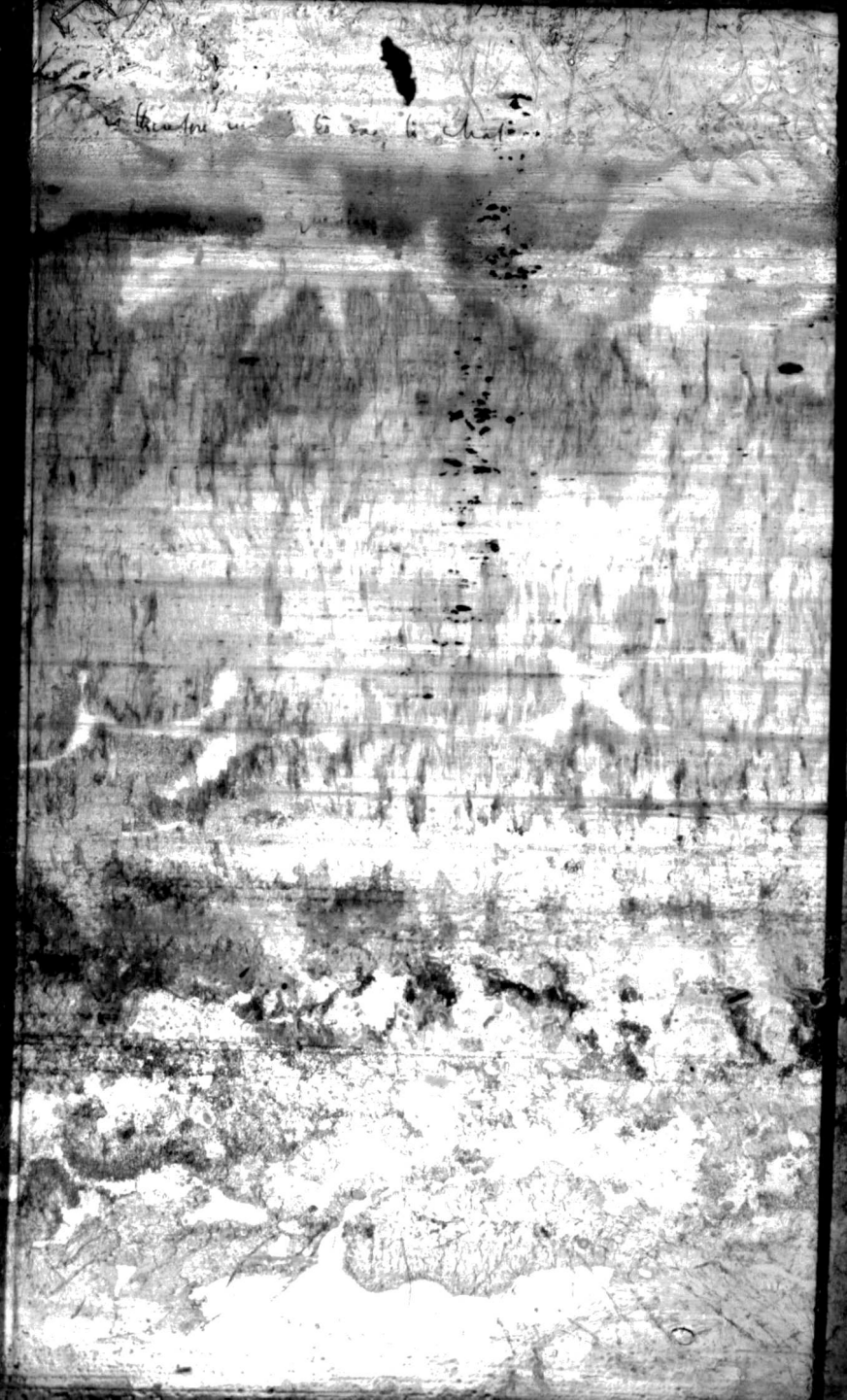

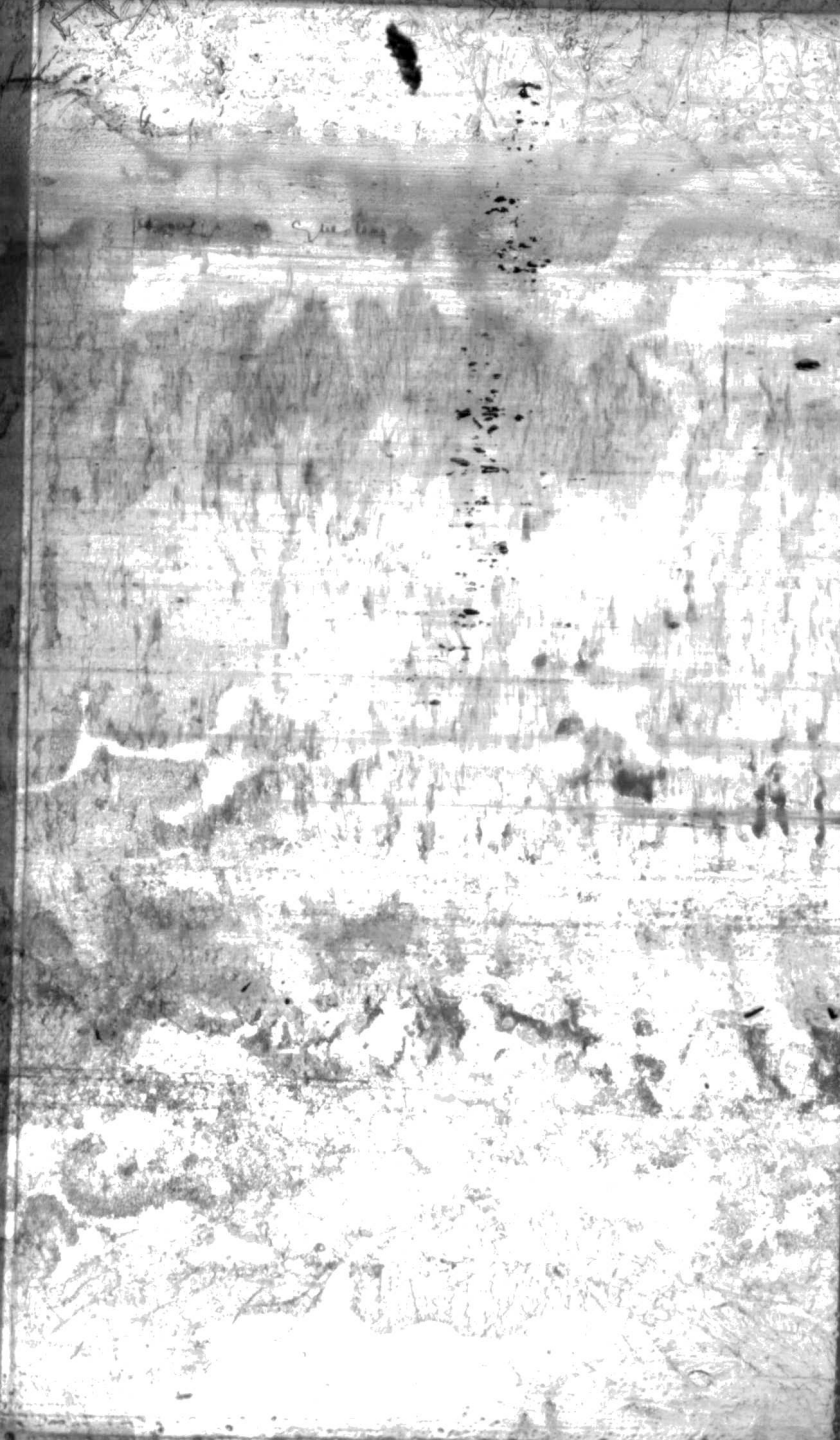
