No. 209. Your telegram 25th October. Reports just received officer in charge of Turkhana point to serious danger of general outbreak along border possibly affecting materially northern district unless absolutely and not hampered by Uganda in dealing with situation. Present position is that after pacification we were administering Turkhana; they were raided by Uganda Suk Karamojo, who committed horrible atrocities, massacred large numbers, reprisals took place, a great many raiders killed during retreat. Kraals raided may have been in territory of Uganda technically speaking, but of course that makes no difference whatever. These tribes do not respect boundary at present. Turkhana now ask for us join in attacking Suk or at any rate protection from such raids in future. Quite unable to comply unless I have free hand; could only result in weakness of our prestige. Position of our officer extremely dangerous. Would ask that administration of Uganda send one company of troops with military officer accompanied by administrative officer. Take charge district; could be sent via Nakuru Baringo to the scene (of) disturbance where we would be glad to co-operate; Proposal made to be preferred but if Uganda unwilling (?) would be prepared to arrange with our troops establish district there, but it must be included in our territory as well as possible. Reserves appear to have left Hinterland Elgon take care of itself for many years. Elephant slaughter. Ivory trading reported rife. Reply urgently required owing to my departure.
