In reply to Lord Crew's despatch No. 656 of the 28th ultimo, respecting the proposed inspection of Cyprus Railways by Mr. H. A. F. Currie, I have the honour to report that it would be somewhat inconvenient for him to make the journey next time as suggested, since both Mr. Cruickshank and Mr. Church and possibly also Mr. Sandiford will be on leave at that time.

2. Mr. Currie's six months leave is however due in April 1911 and if the inspection could be delayed till then, he could go in March of that year and visit Cyprus on the way home.

3. As an alternative he might make a special journey in March next, returning here before Mr. Cruickshank starts on leave, but this would not be so convenient in view of the Nagadi scheme and other important matters now on the tapis.

4. It would also be a more expensive plan as there would be the extra cost of the passages to and
