With reference to Mr:Fiddes's letter No:35665 W.A. of the 16th November last, enclosing a copy of rules, as approved by the Secretary of State, governing the various Fine Funds connected with the West African Railways, I am directed by the Comptroller and Auditor General to enquire whether it is intended to introduce rules which have been similarly approved for the control of the Fine Fund administered by the authorities of the Uganda Railway.

2. This question was raised by the Local Auditor in the East Africa Protectorate (Query 105 of 15th March 1909 - copy, with reply, enclosed) and has been held over for settlement pending the decision of the Secretary of State with regard to the Funds of the West African Railways.

It is requested that it may be stated whether the formation of the Fines Fund and the scheme for its Administration has received the covering sanction of the Secretary of State.

I cannot trace any sanction of the Secretary of State, but I do not consider such sanction necessary.

The Railway Act, the general Rules under the Railway Act and the conditions of service allow of fines being inflicted and it is the universal custom on Railways to utilize the Fine Fund for the benefit of employees. The Administration of the Fund is always in the hands of the Manager subject to record at Official meeting.
