Identification of Arms.

Sir:-

In my note of October 13th 1908, I had the honour
under instructions from my Government to propose to you
that, with a view to the execution of article 6 of the
agreement of December 13th 1906 relative to the arms traffic,
the three contracting powers should reciprocally communicate
to one another the forms of the acts of nationality of the
dhow flying their respective flags instead of the annual
lists of the dhows themselves. The British Government
agreed to this proposal, as you informed me in your note
of January 7th 1909, and in a note addressed to Count de Tol-
dari, dated April 3rd last, they expressed their intention
of modelling their forms so far as possible upon the type
of those which are issued by the Italian authorities and
which had in the meantime been communicated to the British
Government.

The Italian Government then endeavoured to secure a
similar adhesion on the part of the French Government; and

the latter, after some negotiation, also accepted the Italian proposal but modified it in the sense that the reciprocal communication of the forms should not take the place of that of the annual lists but should be made supplementary to the latter formality which would facilitate the task of fixing the nationality of drivers in the event of their names not figuring on the lists.

The Italian Government having agreed in their turn to this modification have instructed me to inform you of the fact and to ask you to be good enough to let me know whether the British Government are also prepared to accept it, in order that steps may be taken to exchange the forms with the Government of the French Republic.

In awaiting the reply which you may be good enough to make to me.
