Sir,

I have the honour to report that applications have been received by the Controller, Military Accounts, Northern Circle and the Accountant General, Bombay from Government Pensioners asking that arrangements may be made for payment of their pensions, in future, at Nairobi in East Africa.

The list of the Colonial Treasuries in Appendix 15 to the Civil Service Regulations, 5th Edition, where leave allowances and pension may be made payable on behalf of the Government of India, does not include Nairobi. But in view of the present and future emigration of Indians to British East Africa the number of such cases may increase and I would request that
