Sir:-

I am directed by the Marquess of Lansdowne to transmit to you, to be laid before Mr. Secretary Lyttelton, a copy of a note from the French Minister respecting the decision of His Government to re-establish the French Consular Agency at Mombasa, and to appoint as Consular Agent Monsieur Carougeau, resident at that place.

I am to state that the French Government in 1899 informed His Majesty's Government that the French Consul at Zanzibar had been authorized to create a Consular Agency at Mombasa and to appoint Mr. A. Izac to the post. His Majesty's Government replied that they took no exception to Mr. Izac, and would be ready to recognize him as Consular Agent whenever French Consular jurisdiction in the Zanzibar Dominions came to an end.

In a note dated May 13th, 1904 the French Am-

bassador

Ambassador stated that the French Government recognized the British Courts as those possessing jurisdiction both in Zanzibar and on the mainland dominions of the Sultan.

Lord Lansdowne sees no objection therefore to the recognition of a French Consular Agent at Mombasa, and I am to request that should Mr. Lyttelton also see no objection to the appointment of Monsieur Carougeau, the necessary orders for his recognition in the above capacity may be issued, and His Lordship informed whether such instructions have been given.
