Sir:-

We have the honour to put before you the following facts with reference to the loss of 5,000 dollars on the Abyssinian Border and the property of this Company.

This Company was granted permission in 1908 by the Under Secretary of State for the Colonies to trade from Mombasa, British East Africa, to the Abyssinian border and at the same time a permit was obtained from the Emperor Menelik to trade in Abyssinia South, across the British East African border.

In July of last year, Captain G. F. Midell, M.V.O., our then General Manager, proceeded from Nairobi to the Abyssinian border (i.e. Fort Harrington) Captain Midell found that we did not at that time require a

money, and Mr. Zaphiro, the Government Agent, agreed to take care of same in Fort Harrington, until another of this Company's employees arrived.

Mr. Zaphiro gave Captain Riddell a clean receipt for the money and this is now in our possession.

In December last the British East Africa Government informed our Manager in Mombasa that the Government troops in Fort Harrington had captured and stolen the 20,000 dollars aforementioned, and that every effort would be made to capture the culprits, but we are informed that no capture has as yet been effected.

The matter was taken up with His Excellency Sir Percy Girouard, one of our Directors and a claim was made for same, but the claim was refused on the ground that Mr. Zaphiro was not an employee of the Protectorate, but is controlled by the British Minister at Mombasa, and we therefore beg to make a formal claim through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs for the sum of £1000 being the equivalent of 5,000 dollars stolen.
