## East Africa Protectorate

Zanzibar,

27 AUGUST 1940

I have the honor to call your attention

to the fact that in the new Game Licence, No. 19 of 1909,

all British officers in the service of the Zanzibar

Colonial Government are entitled to the free grant of a

game licence without payment.

Under the provisions of Ordinance No. 1 of 1906, they

are entitled to a free game licence, which entitles them

to take a game licence for one year or 30 days, or 140 days for one

year or 30 days, or 280 days or fourteen consecutive

days.


Under the new Game Licence, they obtain a short period

of time to obtain a game licence, but this

is not sufficient to obtain a limited number of the

game licences.

I would observe that officers of His Majesty's  
Army assigned to this station are still in the same  
position as members of the East Africa Protectorate in  
that they have been given a somewhat hard  
time. Zanzibar officers should be deprived of the  
privileges formerly enjoyed.  
I do not think it would be wise to avoid  
the giving of such a concession and in these circumstances  
I would suggest that Your Excellency could see  
your way to considering the advisability of extending  
the privileges of a public officer's license to officers  
of Her Britannic Majesty's Government  
stationed here.
