In reference to previous correspondence ending with my letter of the 7th instant respecting the proposed expedition to British East Africa of Count Salm-Reifferscheidt, I am directed by the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to transmit to you for submission to the Earl of Cromer, the enclosed translation of a note from the Austro-Hungarian Ambassador from which it appears that Count Salm has proposed to start his expedition from Marseilles on the 4th proximo, and to proceed direct to Mombasa. I am to enquire whether I could be furnished with letters of introduction in favour of Count Salm-Reifferscheidt to the authorities of the East Africa Protectorate and of Uganda.
