Sir:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir Edward Grey to acknowledge the receipt of your letter 32305/1910 of the 22nd instant enclosing a letter from Mr. H. A. Tate asking for further information as to the terms of his appointment as Acting Collector at Pemba.

With regard to Mr. Tate's first question I am to request that Mr. Tate may be asked whether it would not be possible for him to proceed to his post before the beginning of February. As Sir E. Grey understands that the salary attached to the post of Collector at Pemba is considerably in excess of that at present enjoyed by Mr. Tate he thinks it possible that Mr. Tate would in the circumstances be willing to forfeit a month or six weeks of his leave.

With regard to the question of leave and the amount of passage fare I am to state that Sir E.
