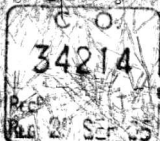

## THE UNIVERSITIES' MISSION TO CENTRAL AFRICA

18th. September 1905.

Sir:-

I have the honour to acknowledge and to thank you for the receipt of your letter of September 12th. in which you are good enough to send us further information respecting the rising in German East-Africa.

From letters which I have recently received from the Bishop of Zanzibar, His Lordship was evidently uneasy about the presence in the Rovuma country of such a large number of the Angoni, whom he had seen during his recent visit to Masasi, and his reflection was that if any trouble happened to any of our Mission Stations in that district, it would be through them and not through the inhabitants.

We are anxious as to the effect which the Angoni joining the rising may have upon the Yaos.
