Sir:-

I am directed by Secretary Sir E. Grey to transmit, to be laid before the Earl of Elgin, the accompanying copy of a communication from the Italian Embassy asking that facilities may be afforded to Captain Count Giovanni Marchetti degli Angelini who is going on a shooting expedition to British East Africa.

In enquiring what answer Lord Elgin would wish returned to this application I am to point out that it is not stated that the expedition is in any way connected with any scientific purpose and that there would therefore appear to be no reason why Count Marchetti should be accorded greater facilities than are granted to British subjects in similar circumstances.
