We might now address the business of the
last African Note with regard to sending home
(1) schedules of despatches to C.O., (2) ackts. of desps.
telegrams, &c. from C.O. (3) schedules of unacknowledged
despatches. Apart from the usefulness and checking
power of these statements, it is well that the
practice in these Notes should be in line with
that in the Colonial Service generally. We followed
a similar course with regard to P.C.A. Notes.

Accordingly I submit draft for consent.

I have added a para. requesting the Note
to send home duplicates of these desps. the same
and duplicates from this end. This practice is now
in force in connection with most of the Colonies and the
duplicates are, I believe, very useful.
