Sir,

I have the honour to transmit to you herewith and to recommend for your favourable consideration a copy of a despatch with enclosures which I have received from the Post Master General requesting authority to expend the sum of two hundred pounds on the erection of a telephone line between Mioro Station and Lord Delamere's estate, and one hundred and eighty pounds on a post office at Niono. Of this amount it is only desired to spend the first item, viz: two hundred pounds, during the current financial year, and this sum can be met by savings from the Postal estimates. It will suffice if the second item is included in next year's budget, and this matter is only brought forward now as it forms a part of the telephone scheme.

2. As reported by Mr. Cosling, Lord Delamere has agreed to guarantee such a revenue as will warrant the establishment of a Post office at Nioro, and in view of the fact that owing to the increasing number of colonists round that Station it will in any case be necessary to open a Post Office there shortly, I venture to hope that this proposal will meet with your approval.

Sir:-

I have the honour to inform you that Lord
Salisbury recently requested me to go into the question
of the provision of telephone communication between Mjoro
station and his camp and farm. He wished to know if
the Administration would undertake to provide this, and
if so upon what terms.

I pointed out to his lordship that it was not
usual for the administrations of British Colonies to
provide telephone communication excepting in cases where
the wires formed part of a telephone exchange, or were
connected with a Post Office as private wires; further
that there is no Post Office at Mjoro. I suggested
that it would be found to establish a Post Office
at or near Mjoro, taking anything like relief money
from it might then be possible to make some arrangement
regarding the telephone communication. His lordship
intimated Lord Salisbury understood to enter into an
agreement guaranteeing such arrangement until such time
as the

the establishment of a Post Office: this on the lines sometimes adopted for telegraph offices in England where a minimum revenue is guaranteed by the United portion.

3. The question of the terms upon which the telephone could be erected was discussed with the Superintendent of Telegraphs at an interview at Bombay on the 10th ultim. An extract from the memorandum of that interview is enclosed, from which it will be seen that the estimated cost of the line is £200 and the necessary annual charge £70 per annum, subject to a guarantee of five years' rental. The amount of the proposed rental, together with a statement of certain conditions which are necessary owing to the route of the proposed line being unsurveyed, was then communicated to Lord Delamere. Subject to your approval being obtained for the expenditure involved, our Lordship has accepted the terms and conditions proposed.

4. I now beg to request authority for the expenditure of a sum of £380, viz:- £200 for the proposed telephone line and £180 for a Post Office building at Hjoro. Of this amount £200 is desired to be expended during the current financial year and £180 next year.
..... Dealing first with the sum of £200 I submit that it is desirable that telephone communication be kept under the control of the State, and private wires erected according to the arrangements customary in other Colonies; further that the placing of Lord Delamere's establishment in telephonic communication with a Post and Telegraph Office is desirable in that it will encourage the use of the telegraph and so increase the revenue. The terms proposed have been
considered

compared with those charged elsewhere (I have obtained for reference copies of the Postal Guides of every important British Colony) and they are rather more in favour of the Government than is customary. In this regard I would remark that until we have more practical experience of the effects of lightning currents on telephones in West Africa than we at present possess it is desirable to anticipate a heavy depreciation from this cause, and charge accordingly.

4. The amount required could be re-allocated from the salaries vote of this Department. Five European officers whose appointments have been provided for in the Estimates cannot, according to the latest advice, be appointed in time to draw pay before the end of June, and the sum of £210 (being the amount of their joint salaries for the first quarter of the financial year) should therefore be available.

5. If you should so far approve of this proposal as to forward it for motion of the Secretary of State I beg that I may be advised accordingly in order that the Superintendent of Telegraphs may at the same time forward his indent for the necessary material; this to be passed to the Crown Agents if the re-allocation is allowed.

7. With regard to the sum of £180 for a Post Office at Ijoro, including quarters for a Postmaster, I submit a plan and specification, together with an estimate by the Director of Public Works which is for the amount stated. It will suffice if the amount is included in the Estimates for the next financial year as the telephone line will be completed before April

next. I bring the matter forward now simply because the provision of a Post Office building at Njoro is an integral part of the proposed arrangement with Lord Delamere. I may add that the colonisation around Njoro is such that it will in any case probably be necessary to open a Post Office there in the course of the next eighteen months.

SPECIFICATION FOR A BUILDING SUITABLE FOR A POST & TELEGRAPH OFFICE AT NJORO.

—00—

1. Building to be of corrugated iron of internal dimensions 23 ft. by 24 ft. divided into 3 rooms as shown on plan annexed. To be erected upon masonry supports so as to leave a space of 2 ft. between the floor and the earth.
2. Rooms to be 12 ft. high from floor to spring of roof and 15 ft. from floor to ridge.
3. Room to be lined and ceiled with deal or other suitable wood.
4. Covered verandah 24 ft. by 8 ft. with raised wooden flooring to be provided in front of building for convenience of public; 3 outer and 2 inner doors and 3 medium and 2 large windows to be fitted as shown on plan.
5. One counter window with doors for closing and one counter 4 ft. broad and 8 ft. long with two drawers 2 ft. by 2 ft. and 9 inches deep to be provided. Also screen for telegraph instruments 5 ft. long and 5 ft. high as shown on plan.
6. Corrugated iron out-house 16 ft. long and 8 ft. wide without floor or lining, to be erected and divided into 2 portions so as to form a boys' house and cook house. Out-house to be 8 ft. from ground to spring of roof and 15 ft. to ridge. One door for each room to be provided but no windows.
7. A small privy with pit to be supplied.
8. All windows of the Post Office proper to be fitted with iron bars.
9. Letter box 2 ft. high and 2 ft. broad and 15 inches deep fitted with door at back and with lock and key; also aperture to permit of the posting of letters to be provided in the Post Office.
10. All outer doors giving access to the building to be fitted with wooden steps.
