With reference to the engraved proof of the new P.S. currency Act for the East Africa Protectorate, which was recently shown to me at the Colonial Office and on which I would request to make any suggestion that might occur to me, I have the honour to submit the following remarks:

1. The inscription on proof of the Act is that the "Government of East Africa and Uganda" "Protectorate" promote to

demanded the sum of  
five rupees. By the  
"East Africa and Uganda  
(Currency) Order in Council, 1905,"  
however, the Government of  
East Africa only is  
responsible for the redemption  
of the notes. This is laid  
down in section 14, subsection (2)  
of the said Order. I have  
accordingly with honor to  
suggest that all reference  
to the Uganda Protectorate  
be omitted from the notes  
if it be desired to indicate  
on the notes themselves  
that they are, as provided  
by section 16 of the Order,  
a legal tender in both  
Protectorates. I have the  
honor to suggest that  
some special exception  
to that effect be added,  
though such a course  
would appear to be  
hardly necessary, at any  
rate in the Budget which  
might

right well when the notes  
are first put into circulation  
would be greatly simplified.

2. I observed that the  
notes not are dated from  
Nairobi, whereas the Office  
of the Currency Board  
where the notes are  
redeemable, (section 14,  
sub-section (3)) is located  
at Mombasa (section 3,  
subsection (2)). I have  
therefore the honor to  
suggest that "Mombasa"  
be substituted for  
"Nairobi" on the notes.

I attach reference to  
the manner of the  
authentication of the notes  
section 15, subsection (2) of  
the Order in Council - I  
have the honor to suggest

that an engraved facsimile  
of the signature of the Treasurer of the  
Africa Protectorate, who

the only ex officio member  
of the Currency Board, (section 3,  
subsection (1)) on behalf of the  
Currency Commission, be  
sufficient. On the  
Bombay Government Circular  
not only one signature  
appears and that in the  
form of an impression  
facsimile.
