Surveying are granted to persons by H. M. Government on the recommendation of the Chief Surveyor after he has examined all affidavits, papers showing his previous qualifications, experience and theoretical & practical skill. These rules set out in section 6 to be passed.

The cost of the Licence  
is £35/-

The Licence or the grantee Surveyor is made under the direction & control of the Survey Dept and upon producing satisfactory com-

pliance plans & paid the whole of fees chargeable by Govt for such survey, which fees are set forth in the Official Gazette, dated November December 24<sup>th</sup> 1903.

There are now 8 Surveyors who have been granted licences for these terms - the dangerous work is guaranteed to them, but at present they are apparently in keeping them fully employed.

Surveyors have to take out site, without doubt at first labour under the senior's disadvantage of not knowing

either the Country or his language  
and will find the payments  
which are necessary kept low  
continuously. If it is not  
found however that there are  
present in the Country enough  
Indigent men kept in constant  
employment to do so, however  
always possible.]
