licenses expiring on March 31st, we should be not un-
likely to deter a certain proportion of them from shooting
at all, and our revenue from this source would suffer
accordingly.

I have therefore caused the above mentioned Ordinance
to be promulgated pending the completion of a draft embodying
all existing legislation on the subject which I am preparing
in conjunction with the Ugandan authorities.
