Please see P. T. Morris minute on
Monda's dep. 20/130 of 3 July 1905. He
states ^{verbal} by ^{the} principle, as an accepted
one, that acting allowances are given to
officers acting for superior officers, not to
officers merely acting in inferior posts.

Thus Mr Webster cannot be considered to have
acted for the late Mr. de la Cloche & asked
Col. Suter definitely not described him an
allowance for acting as Collector - although
it is hard in the ^{present} way, as it is given
late officer's salary.

If we are to keep up the precedent
and we shall probably let on the
next first of June, I would say
that it is not right to give an
allowance of £400 to Mr Webster
in view of the fact that he is
not in a position of
special concern, & especially
when he is not in a position of
superior command.

allowances to be made for the

logical basis for the F.O. rule - which
arises in this case - that if Mr. Witter
left him enough leave Mr. Witter
might keep the expense of his acting

next to you in view of the large
amount of the salary during the contract
