Please see Mr Francis minute on Uganda's dup. no. 130 of 2. May 1905. He then lays down the principle, as an accepted one, that acting allowances are given to officers acting for superior officers, not to officers merely acting in superior posts.

Thus Mr Webster cannot be considered to have acted for the late Mr de la Clouston, & instead Col. Suter definitely made demerit in an allowance for acting as Collector although it is based in the usual way on the late officer's salary.
