Sir,

In obedience to the instructions contained in the Marquess of Lansdowne's despatch No. 470 of August 19th last, I have the honour to report that I drew my Legal Adviser's attention to the fact that the order issued by Mr. Nobley under the Cattle Disease Ordinance, 1902, was apparently ultra vires so far as it deals with the prohibition of importation of cattle from South Africa South of 10° South.

In order to remove all doubt as to the legality of the order in question and to give the Commissioner extended powers in dealing with the prevention of disease - such extended powers being in the opinion of the Chief Veterinary Officer imperative - I requested my Legal Adviser to draft an amended Cattle Disease Ordinance, which is intended to take

the place of the old one, and which I have published in accordance with the terms of the Order in Council 1902, Article 12. 288

This ordinance Mr. Barth has drafted in conjunction with Mr. Storis. It is based on the Cape Colony Law, the British Central Africa Ordinance and our own law on the subject. Some of the provisions of the English Statute (Diseases of Animals Act, 1896) have also been incorporated.
