

Its message from Col Smith who, to avoid handing over neutral country to the Germans, desires to alter instructions of commission and to extend their survey to lake Jipe.

TELEGRAM. Commissioner Sir D. Stewart to Mr. Lyttelton.

(Received Colonial Office 11.10 p.m. 19th April, 1908.)

Following received from Colonel Smith-Angley German Boundary Commissioner. On reaching East terminal I find marks on ground 9 initialled Sir Arthur Hardinge in error hand over much country to the Germans. Recommend demarcation of boundary as far as Lake Jipe by present Commission. May I suggest following joint instructions to English and German Commissioners. First paragraph. Anglo-German Boundary Commission to demarcate boundary from East terminal of present labour to Lake Jipe. They will comply with agreement of 1893 and adopt maps I.D.W.O.976 (a) I.D.W.O.976 of Boundary Commission 1893 creating claims as necessary. Paragraph two. Should wording be doubtful authority of map of Commission shall be accepted. Paragraph three. Should details of map I.D.W.O.976 (a) be found show discrepancies with ground latitudes and longitude of points along boundary shall be measured on map 976 (a). Positions measured will be found on ground by trigonometrical resection or otherwise convenient trigonometrical measurements from trigonometrical joints of map I.D.W.O.976 using co-ordinates as marked on map. Paragraph four. Boundary Commission may require entry sufficient to show final positions. Paragraph five. Should existing provisional marks be less than 500 metres in error Boundary Commission may recommend they should be final. Please send Hartlaub's map of Africa by Treaty 1890 1890 agreements copy of correspondence C S Smith's despatch on latter portion of his work extract from his report. Estimate extra time as six weeks.
