I think it will be as well to pass the OMC  
mutatis mutandis for Guyana, which is  
in the same position as S. Africa, but  
perhaps a less bitter case than Guyana first.

I do not know when or where get this  
OMC passed, & as this is a matter of  
urgency & the Govt asks for ideas, after  
reply has not been better, I suggest to  
the effect that clause 24 of S. Africa order  
of 1952 does not permit removal of  
constituted officers to UK and that Col  
Pine Removal Act does not at present  
apply to the Partidom but will be  
applied by OMC immediately. I add that  
some little time must elapse after the Act  
has been applied before the removal can be  
removed as the S of S must send out  
the necessary Order of Removal ~~and~~  
but <sup>do</sup> see now the Committee signature  
before removal can take place.

It will probably be well advised when the  
time comes to send out also the form of  
warrant for removal to be issued by the  
Comd. also may very possibly be  
conformable with or inferior to that of  
these forms.]

Applying the Colonial Business General Act 1904  
to the S. Africa Protectorate

Whereas H.M. the King has power and jurisdiction  
within ~~the South African Protectorate~~  
within <sup>the limits of</sup> South Africa as defined by the S. Africa  
Order 1902 & for therein referred to as "South Africa"  
Now therefore H.M. by virtue and in exercise of the  
powers in this behalf by the Col. Business General  
Act 1904 or otherwise in that behalf lawfully  
by or with the advice of the P. Council to order,  
and it is hereby ordered, as follows :-

1. The aforesaid Col. Business Act ~~shall~~ <sup>as defined by 1902 Act</sup> shall apply to  
and take effect within South Africa, as if that  
place were a British possession and part of H.M.'s  
dominions
2. In order to carry out the application of the aforesaid  
Act to ~~the~~ South Africa ~~Protectorate~~ the Commission  
or any person or persons lawfully discharging  
the functions of Commission may exercise  
all powers vested by the 1904 Act in the  
Governor of a British possession
