my despatch No. 206 of April 50th, has submitted a request that his twelve military service may count towards pension under the Africa Protectorate rules.

2. The reasons on which he bases his request are as follows:-

The Administration of the Province of Jubaland was taken over by the Military Department in 1901 since which time Captain Salkeld has been doing civil work there. In consequence of this it was considered advisable, when the post of the Officer Commanding, Jubaland, became vacant, to promote Captain Kirkpatrick rather than Captain Salkeld.
