My Lord,

With reference to Your Lordship's Confidential despatch (4) of the 10th ultimo, I have the honour to report [redacted] Jolly's claim for a compensatory grant in respect of land at Muhoroni abandoned by him is quite unfounded.

2. The facts of the [redacted] are as follows:-

Mr. Jolly and a gentleman named Duder applied on behalf of themselves and three other individuals whose power of attorney they held, for five farms of four thousand acres each at Muhoroni, in all twenty thousand acres, and not forty thousand as stated by the Firm in their letter of March 27th to the Crown Agents. Mr. Jolly's failure to pay survey fees his application
was cancelled, and instructions were given to survey only
the remaining sixteen thousand acres. Mr. Jolly's abandon-
ment of the land applied for by him was therefore due
solely to his own inability or unwillingness to pay survey
fees, and there can be no question of compensation.

With regard to the Company's operations on the
Juba River, I have the honour to refer Your Lordship to my
confidential despatch (19) of the 25th ultimo, in which I
expressed doubt as to the sincerity of their intention in
that quarter.
