My Lord,

In paragraph 5 of Lord Curzon's despatch
 No. 149 of April 20th it is laid down that the leave of
 those officials of the Uganda Railway who have been
 placed on the pensionable establishment shall be
 governed by the Protectorate leave rules. No mention
 is, however, made of those officers not admitted to the
 pensionable establishment. There are a number of
 temporary officers serving on the Railway and
 it would, I submit, be inconvenient and undesirable if
 two different sets of leave rules were in force at the
 same time.
