My Lord,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt
of Your Lordship's despatch No.379 of 2nd ultimo regarding
the appointments of Sergeants Wood and Milton in the
Police Force.

2. With reference to the last paragraph, I have
the honour to state that both Sergeants Milton and
Richardson, whose temporary appointments as Instructors

were reported in my despatches Nos.270 and 363 of May
21st and July 5th respectively, have been well reported
on by the Acting Inspector General of Police and I
recommend their transfers being confirmed.

3. From the Staff List which I forwarded to Your Lordship in my despatch No. 365 of 15th ultime you will observe that there are three vacancies in the ranks of the Assistant District Superintendents, and as reported in my telegram No. 81 of July 10th, I advocate the promotion of Messrs. Watcham, Bentley and Tyssen to fill these posts. Should Your Lordship concur in this proposal, there will be three vacancies in the ranks of Inspectors and a similar number in the ranks of Sergeant Instructors. I can find suitable candidates for the former locally, though I should prefer men from home, who have had previous police experience, if such are obtainable. With regard to the latter I have the honour to request that the Army Council may be approached with a view to obtaining three non-commissioned officers from Infantry Regiments and Sergeant Instructors.

4. I have already reported that the agreements entered into with Sergeants Guest and Hughes expire on December 1st and asked that their vacancies may be filled (vide my despatch No. 365 of July 6th). We therefore require three non-commissioned officers at once and two


