

Sir,

I have the honour to furnish to you Supplemental Estimates for the current year. I have framed them at a figure which will enable me to utilize the existing Staff to the utmost.

I have the honour to draw your attention to Home Office despatch No.147 of the 21st March 1896, in which, in consequence of my representation in England, supplementary estimates were contemplated as a probable contingency; and which shows that the Office is likely to approve of them.

There is however one exception to this general principle, that is to say, I propose in them an increase of Cadastral Staff, from the commencement of cadastral work in the Sotik region on the 1st of January 1897, at which date I hope that the trigonometrical work in that part will be complete. Having decided to begin in Sotik it is essential that work should be continuous until completion of the same. The staff of the Cadastral Branch is fully employed already.

About the 1st of January I propose to transfer the Trigonometrical Staff from Sotik in order to commence the work more
