Sir.

I am directed by the Beard of Customs to forward, for the consideration of the Secretary of State, the enclosed copy of a letter that has been received from Mr. David Thomson, an Officer of this Service who was appointed by Sir Eldon Gorst's letter of 9th December 1904 as an Assistant of Customs (on probation) under the Administration of the East Africa Protectorate, and who now desires, on the completion of one year's service, to return to his former position in this Department.

I am to invite attention to the statement centained in the penultimate paragraph of Mr. Thomson's letter, and I am to suggest that the Administration of the Protectorate may be informed of the regulation contained in the 3rd paragraph of Sir Eldon Gerst's letter of the 15th Getober, 1904, vis:- that "if the Officers selected "should elect to resign their appointments at the end "of twelve months service in Africa... they "would be paid their passage home and allewed two "months leave, to recken from the date of their "departure from Mombass, on full pay".

Honourable Sirs.

I respectfully beg to bring to your Homours' notice the circular letter (a copy of which I have the honour to transmit herewith) embedying the arrangements with regard to the provisional transfer of the two Assistanta (of show I am one) from the Home Customs to the Customs Department of the Sait Africa Protectorate.

In view of the above-mentioned letter and as I shall have completed one year's residential service on the 5th proximo I respectfully beg to inform your Honours that, owing to the uncertainty of future premetion in the Gustoms Department of this Protectorate as well as owing to the trying conditions of life that prevail here, I desire to return to my former employment in the Home Customs.

I have already intimated to the Government of the Protectorate that I shall elect to revert to my former employment but that, after completing one year's residential service. I should be willing to remain on, if it should be so desired and provided that your Henours' sanction were obtained, for such time as would allow of my being relieved by another man. I have been notified, however, that the administration here is not aware of the arrangements set forth in the letter above referred to and that it would appear I can vacate my present position after one year's service, only on condition that I shall refund the outward passage allowance, not being entitled, in such case, to the cost of my passage back to England.

Under these circumstances, therefore, I have taken the liberty of addressing your Honours.

The Board having required a communication from the Foreign Office requesting them to recommend two suitable persons for appointment as desistants of Contons in the East Africa Protecturate. -

I am to direct you to report to the Board, he early as possible, the names of any Massiring Officers or Assistants between the ages of 25 and 30 within your port or district, ato, in your opinion, are qualified for and desirous of, appointment to this position, with applications from the Officers themselves for consideration of their claims.

It is important that you should be catinfied that the general health of all Office, where means are submitted as candidates, is strong enough to fit them for life in a tropical deuntry as to which they will have to satisfy the medical advisor of the Foreign Office. The Candidates must be of unexceptionship character and strictly sober habits.

The Customs Department of the Protectorate is organised as follows :-

- l Chief of Customs, Salary £700 per shown.
- 1 Assistant Chief of Costoms, £300 by £10 to £400 per annum.
- 2 Aseristants of Customs, £250 by £10 to £300 per annum.

The Officers seld cted for merrice in the East Africa Protectorate will not be required to resign their positions in the Home Service definitely on selection, but will receive leave of absence for the necessary period, and be appointed on probation for 12 months' residential service in the Protectorate. During this period the selected Officers would be seconded in the Home Customs Department and no increment would accrue; but they would retain their right of semiority and, at the termination of the period they would be called upon to decide whether they elect to resign the Home Contons definitely on transfer to the Protesterate or to revert to their former employment - in which came the passage home would be defrayed and leave of absence granter for two months communating from the date of departure from Mombasa, at the expiration of which they would be re-employed in the Home Customs.
