Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that when proceeding on leave on the 12th instant Mr. Noble again intimated that his resignation might be anticipated and asked to be supplied only with a single passage (instead of the customary return ticket) as he "would not be returning in the Government service".

2. In view of the previous history of his case I declined to accept any immediate statement from Mr. Noble and ^{with} asked him to talk the matter over with his father upon arrival in England. I pointed out that his final decision should be communicated to the Secretary of State as early as possible as the leave of other Officers would be affected by his resignation unless steps could be taken to secure the appointment of a successor who could arrive at Mombasa early in February next. Mr. Noble promised to intimate a final decision within a few days of his reaching London.
