Sir,

Adverting to Mr. Antrebus' letter of the 5th ultimo (7434/1906) relative to Mr. H.B. Muff's service in the East African Protectorate, I am directed by the Board of Education to state for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies that the Board are pleased to comply with the request made therein that Mr. Muff may be lent for a further period of six months with a view to the preparation of a preliminary geological report on the better known parts of the Protectorate.

I am, however, to say that as the Survey work upon which Mr. Muff was engaged at the time of his departure for Uganda remains uncompleted, it is necessary that he should resume work in Scotland not later than the beginning of November next.

The Board note that the Secretary of State will apply to His Majesty's Treasury for Their Lordships concurrence to the extension of Mr. Muff's service as indicated, and they presume that the existing arrangements as to repayment of Mr. Muff's salary to the Board will be continued during this extended absence.
