I am now informed by one of the largest pencil manufacturers in this country that they are willing to give orders for a number of "slats" if these could be suitably cut in East Africa.

I now write to enquire with whom I should communicate on this subject? I understood that the Company with which Mr. Grogan is connected would not be prepared for some time to undertake the commercial supply of this wood.
